
**Length** – 300 to 600 words Choose <u>one</u> of the three novels below. Complete the expository writing project based on the novel you read.

#### The Structure for an Expository Essay

Paragraph 1 – Grabber (hook), review of question, thesis statement (5-8 sentences)
Paragraph 2 – Transition, Point 1 (from your thesis statement), examples and facts, closing (5 – 8 sentences)
Paragraph 3 – Transition, Point 2 (from your thesis statement), examples and facts, closing (5 – 8 sentences)
Paragraph 4 – Transition, Point 3 (from your thesis statement), examples and facts, closing (5 – 8 sentences)
Paragraph 4 – Transition, Point 3 (from your thesis statement), examples and facts, closing (5 – 8 sentences)
Paragraph 5 – Transition, restatement of thesis statement, ending inference (4 – 6 sentences)


The Watson's Go to Birmingham, by Christopher Paul Curtis


### Hatchet by Gary Paulsen
